

Treating information from the internet with care







What's the problem?

- Fake reports are often shared unchecked through social networks and distributed to a large number of people with just a few clicks
- Many articles are far too old to contain new and correct information
- Some people are easily influenced to think certain things, for example because of authorities manipulating them
- Everybody is able to post things in the internet, even unexperienced people who don't know much about the topic they are talking about
- Some people are unable to differentiate fake news from facts

Why is that a problem?

- When people pick out false information from the internet it leads to them ending up with false solutions
- Fake information damages the reputation of someone believing it
- People getting manipulated has many consequences:
 - →untrustworthy elections
 - →they risk other people's health
 - it's dividing our society (the manipulated people on one side, the independent-minded people on the other)
 - the government needs to introduce unnecessary constraints

How to validate the reliability of internet sources

First of all, you can make use of the following precautions:

- 1. Use websites you already know and trust
- 2. Try to use resources teachers gave you
